Welcome to the Jack Mountain Program. Enclosed are an information sheet and various forms that must be followed carefully in order for you to receive Western State College credits in Recreation and Outdoor Education 197 (ROE 197) and/or Environmental Studies 197 (ENVS 197) for the Jack Mountain Program course in which you are enrolling. You must be accepted for a specific Jack Mountain Program course *before* submitting these forms to Western State College. Payment for the *course* is made directly to Jack Mountain Program; payment for *credit* is made to Western State College. Enrollment for credit through Western State College must be completed prior to beginning the Jack Mountain Program course. Attached is a list of the learning objectives which need to be addressed in your final written analysis of the course.

One official transcript will be sent to you after Western State College has evaluated your learning objectives paper, instructor evaluations, and your grade has been processed by the Registrar's Office. If you need additional transcripts, contact the Registrar's Office at Western State College. You may obtain a Transcript Request Form at http://www.western.edu/reg/tran_request.html. Your signature must be on the request as well as your name, Social Security number, date attended, mother's maiden name if applicable, and the name and address of the person who will receive the transcript. Transcripts are \$4.00 each.

Bushcraft and Snowshoe (Winter)	5 credits (ROE: Outdoor Leadership 3 credits, ENVS: Environmental Ethics 2 credits)
Wilderness Bushcraft Semester (Fall)	12 credits (ROE: Outdoor Leadership 3 credits, ENVS: Environmental Ethics 3 credits, ROE: Natural Resource Interpretation 3 credits, ROE: Subsistence Skills 3 credits)
Buscraft Canoe Expedition (Spring)	6 credits (ROE: Outdoor Leadership 3 credits, ENVS: Environmental Ethics 3 credits)
Weeklong Outdoor Skills Courses	2 credits (ROE: Survival Skills)
Winter Survival Weekend	1 credit (ROE: Survival Skills)
Summer Survival Weekend	1 credit (ROE: Survival Skills)
Bushcraft Weekend	1 credit (ROE: Bushcraft Skills)

The student can select how many credits they wish to receive for each Program not to exceed the amounts listed above. The college will award credit to the student for successful completion of the objectives, a satisfactory final written analysis of the course, and full payment of tuition.

Evaluation is based on ---

- * the student's completion of the course.
- * the student's written analysis of the entire experience based on the learning objectives.
- * the student's fulfillment of the learning objectives as evaluated by the Jack Mountain Program instructor(s).

Grading/Incompletes ---

Students are graded on a A,B,C,D,F grade. At the discretion of the instructor of record at Western State College, a student who is unable to complete a course for reasons beyond the student's control (e.g. illness) may be assigned an "Incomplete" (IN). The student must have completed more than one-half of the coursework at an acceptable level at the time of the request for an "Incomplete." The student and the instructor of record must agree upon a plan for the completion of the work within a time period not to exceed one calendar year. If the work has not been completed and the instructor of record has not removed the incomplete grade and recorded a grade on the student's permanent record within that time period, the "IN" will revert to an F.

If a student is sent home by Jack Mountain Program due to behavior or disciplinary issues, Western State College reserves the right to process a failing grade based on the student's dismissal and failure to complete the course. Student does not receive a refund.

Completing B. Registration Form, C. Disclosure, Disclaimer and Waiver Form, and submitting tuition of \$125 per semester credit hour (payable to Western State College), which must be received by Western before you begin your Jack Mountain Program course. Eligible high school students may apply for credit.

D. Learning Objectives/Written Paper

Within three weeks of completing the course, you must e-mail your paper to Layne Nelson extendedstudies@western.edu. Your paper must contain an overview of your course and address the five objectives listed below.

To help you in this process, it is recommended that you keep a detailed journal during your course which tracks your thoughts and experiences in each of the objectives. This paper is not meant to be a meaningless administrative requirement. Rather, it should help you get the most from your field experiences. It should solidify in your mind what happened, help you analyze the pieces involved, and help you transfer or apply this information to your life. In the paper, please briefly describe the course you were enrolled in and then address each objective under its own subheading. Explain how your experiences on your Jack Mountain Program course affected your growth in each area. You are encouraged to support your opinions using properly documented references (APA format). This could include leadership, teaching, or environmental books and articles. Your paper should not be a copy of your journal or simply a documentation of what happened every day of your course. Rather focus on what you were learning using course experience as the backdrop. Describe what you were thinking about and the concepts you formed or accepted. Explain how you might apply this new knowledge to your current life. You can include pictures, poems, graphs, etc. to help you communicate.

Your paper must be typed and double spaced with a cover page, followed by a running heading and page number on each page of the text. Correct grammar and spelling is expected. Careless errors will distract from your presentation and will affect your grade. Use 12 point Times New Roman font and one inch margins. Please keep in mind that this paper should document a learning experience that is equivalent to the credits requested. For example, how much learning and work are required of someone in a three credit class during a full college semester? How much would be required if they were taking a full load of 12 credits for this semester? Please write your paper with that in mind. The length, usually results in approximately two pages per credit, and depth of your paper should be somewhat related to the number of credits you are requesting. Your paper will be evaluated on the following basis: 20% for proper format and clarity in your writing and 80% for content, including adequate and honest coverage assessing your fulfillment of the learning objectives.

Western State College will award credit, as well as a final grade, after you have successfully completed your Jack Mountain Program course based on your field instructor's evaluation, your satisfactory written analysis of the course, and after full payment of tuition has been received. Your final paper and instructor evaluations are **due within three weeks** after the completion of your Jack Mountain Program course. **You must e-mail your paper to extendedstudies@western.edu. After e-mailing your paper, continue to check your e-mail as a reply confirming the arrival of your paper will be sent within 72 hours. If you do not receive that confirmation, resend your paper.** If we have not received your paper four weeks after the course we will make one last attempt to contact you. Sending a late paper will result in a lower grade. If no paper is received five weeks after completion of your course, a grade of unsatisfactory, "F", will be recorded. Please contact this office if you have questions or legitimate concerns with this policy.

OBJECTIVE #1: LEADERSHIP AND TEACHING SKILLS

Jack Mountain Program typically gives many opportunities for students to develop their leadership and teaching skills. Describe how different leadership styles impacted you and your course. Discuss how your leadership skills improved. How did your "leader of the day" go? What did you do well, what do you need to improve on? What feedback did you receive from the group? How will you use this outside of Jack Mountain Program?

Teaching is also a big part of these courses. What impressed you about the teaching you observed and experienced? What did you teach? What did you learn from that experience?

OBJECTIVE #2: TECHNICAL SKILLS

Discuss the specific skills and techniques learned on each component of the course. You were exposed to skills necessary for traveling in the backcountry, wilderness areas, on water and in areas such as climbing. Which do you feel you are competent enough to travel on your own or with a group without a hired guide?

Safety is always emphasized. Assessing risk and deciding which risk to take is different for groups and for individuals. Give an example of a risk that wasn't taken or was modified in order to keep your group safe. How will you determine which risks you will take in your life after completing this course? How has your judgment changed as a result of this experience?

OBJECTIVE #3: COMMUNICATION AND TEAM BUILDING

Good communication is essential for a successful course. Describe your groups attempt to communicate well and become a team. How did the instructors impact that process? What activities helped you learn to communicate better? Give at least three examples of times when your group communicated well and how that impacted the group. Describe at least two times communication was poor and how that affected your group.

When your group became a smoothly working team how did that feel? If you didn't reach that level, and reflecting back on your experience, how could you have changed that? What have you learned about good communication that you can now use in groups?

OBJECTIVE #4: ENVIRONMENTAL PRACTICES AND SAFETY AWARENESS

Each environment you experienced called for particular techniques in order to preserve that ecosystem. Describe what LNT practices you learned for each environment. If they were different, why? You are now at home or at least in a different environment. How will you show respect for the earth and the resources you are using in your daily life?

Students who took courses which interacted with another cultures must also write about that experience. Describe the key characteristics of that culture and how those were different than yours. Discuss how that influenced your experience and your world view. Reflect on and write about your role in the world.

Service is a component of most courses. Indicate whether you did service projects and what they were. Is service important? Why? What did your group gain by involving yourselves for the benefit of others? How will this become part of your lifestyle?

OBJECTIVE #5: SELF GROWTH AND SERVICE

You have spent a week to a semester immersing yourself in this course. Earth based education states there is inherent value in learning and understanding the skills of how to live in the natural world, because it is, and always has been, our home. Does your growth reflect that? Describe areas of growth that you experienced. What are you most pleased with yourself? For those loved ones to whom you have returned, what would they say is most wonderful about the new you? If you have not allowed them to see a new you, why not?
